Management Target: There is a continual increase in the willingness of land managers, other stakeholders and the community to partner Natural Resource Management organisations to deliver natural resource outcomes.

■ Work Undertaken

In May 2006, Western CMA Aboriginal Community Support Officers, Barry Edwards and Blackie Gordon, helped children of Weilmoringle Public School to plant native trees and to provide trees for local people to revegetate the banks of the Culgoa River.

■ Benefits

- Increasing knowledge of the importance of our environment
- Involving the students in choosing and planting their own native tree
- Giving responsibility to care for their tree
- Emphasising links to the students' cultural heritage by planting a quandong and a wild orange tree
- Increasing native vegetation cover
- Improving soil health

Trees were provided to the Community Centre to help revegetate the riverbank and improve water quality in the river.
